This structure aims to provide a comprehensive introduction to the field of linguistics, equipping students with both theoretical knowledge and practical skills.

বাংলা উপন্যাসের রাজপুরোহিত সাহিত্য-সম্রাট বিদ্ধমচন্দ্র চট্টোপাধ্যায়। আর নতুন নতুন রূপ ও রীতির অনুসন্ধানে আন্ত রবীন্দ্রনাথ। আর যাঁরা কথাশিল্পী শরৎচন্দ্রের মতোই বাঙালি মানসকে সাড়া দিয়েছিলেন তাদের মধ্যে ত্রায়ী বন্দ্যোপাধ্যায় (বিভূতিভূষণ বন্দ্যোপাধ্যায়, তারাশঙ্কর বন্দ্যোপাধ্যায়, মানিক বন্দ্যোপাধ্যায়) হলেন অন্যতম। বিভূতিভূষণের উপন্যাসে আছে মানুষ, প্রকৃতি ও আধ্যাত্মিকতার প্রতি টান, তারাশঙ্করের উপন্যাসে আছে আঞ্চলিক বিশেষত্ব এবং মানিকের উপন্যাসে আছে বিজ্ঞানবৃদ্ধি-মানুষের প্রবৃত্তি এবং ফ্রয়েডিয় মনোবিকলনের প্রভাব। পাশাপাশি বর্তমান সময়ে তত্ত্ব-নির্ভর পাঠ দ্বারা দেখানো যেতে পারে তিন বন্দ্যোপাধ্যায় বর্তমান সময়ে দাঁড়িয়েও সমান প্রাসন্ধিন। বিভূতিভূষণের 'নসুমামা ও আমি' গল্পটি কুয়ের তত্ত্ব দিয়ে পাঠ করা চলে। 'হাঁসুলি বাঁকের উপকথা'র নসুবালা আসলে বৃদ্ধা নয় বৃদ্ধ। আসলে তিনি তৃতীয় লিঙ্কের একটি চরিত্র। তপন সিংহের মতো একজন চিত্র পরিচালক নসুবালা চরিত্রকে ভুল মূল্যায়ন করে একটি নারীকে ওই চরিত্রে উপস্থাপন করেছেন। তপন সিংহ পরে নিজে লিখেছেন 'অপরিসীম মূর্খতা আমার'। তারাশঙ্করের 'রাধা' উপন্যাসে বৈষ্ণবীয় তত্ত্বের সাক্ষাৎ মেলে। বর্তমানে একটি বহু আলোচ্য বিষয় ইকোক্রিটিসিজম। বিভূতিভূষণের অনেক গল্প উপন্যাসে এই ইকোক্রিটিসিজমের সাক্ষাৎ মেলে। এই সব কিছু মিলিয়ে বিশ শতকীয় বাংলা কথাসাহিত্যের ঐশ্বর্যমণ্ডিত এবং গৌরবমেয় এক অধ্যায়কে ফিরে দেখাই এই কোর্সের মূল বিষয় হিসেবে গৃহীত হয়েছে।



There are about 7000 languages in the world, but about 25 to 30 scripts are used to write those seven thousand languages. OL CHIKI is an important script in among them. It is used for Santali language. They use about 49 sounds in their speech. To transcribe those 49 sound symbols, 30 main characters and 5 sub-characters are used as sound symbols. Santali is a language of Santal tribe. It is one of the oldest languages of world. More than 12 million people used Santali language on their conversation. There are about one corer speakers in India.


