Report on Sociology Project Work

Introduction: The Department of Sociology at the Government General Degree College, Lalgarh, Jhargram, completed project work with 6th semester honours students as part of their syllabus for the paper **DSE 4-Project: Field Work and Dissertation**. This report outlines the project topics, the candidates involved, the supervision provided, and the outcomes of the project work.

Project Details: Three candidates undertook different research topics as part of their project work:

- 1. Women and Child Labour in Small Industry of Pottery in Chamitara Village, Jhargram, West Bengal
- 2. Effects of Online Education and Multimedia in the Village of Amalia, Jhargram, West Bengal
- 3. Empowerment of Women: Education and Work in the Village of Karganala, Jhargram, West Bengal

These projects were supervised by department faculty members Dr. Amrita Dey and Sri Gour Gopal Barman, ensuring that students received adequate guidance and support throughout their research.

Outcomes: The project work resulted in several significant outcomes:

1. Women and Child Labour in Small Industry of Pottery in Chamitara Village:

- The candidate investigated the socio-economic conditions of women and children working in the pottery industry.
- o Findings highlighted the prevalence of low wages.
- o The candidate understood how gender shapes labour.
- The study also revealed how children are often used as human resource within family structure

2. Effects of Online Education and Multimedia in the Village of Amalia:

- The candidate studied the impact of online education and multimedia tools on students' learning experiences in Amalia.
- Results indicated that while online education has increased accessibility, there
 are challenges related to internet connectivity and digital literacy.
- Suggestions were provided to enhance digital infrastructure and training for teachers and students.

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3. Empowerment of Women: Education and Work in the Village of Karganala:

- o The candidate explored the relationship between education and the empowerment of women in Karganala.
- The study revealed that education has failed to improve women's participation in the workforce and decision-making processes.
- Women in spite of receiving proper education at school and college is not pursuing higher studies or employment
- A reason for this is the prevalent cultural stress on early marriage for both men and women. Also if the women become more educated than men, its difficult to find a groom.

Conclusion: The project work undertaken by the 6th semester honours students of the Department of Sociology at Government General Degree College, Lalgarh, Jhargram, has provided valuable insights into various socio-economic issues. The findings from these projects have the potential to inform policy decisions and contribute to the betterment of the communities studied.
