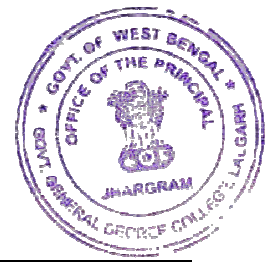

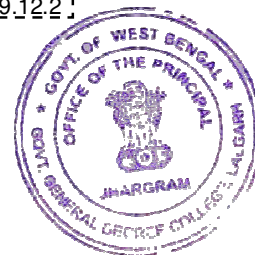

Topic: Understanding the Relationship between Society and Environment

Objective:

The primary objective of the field visit was to explore the relationship between society and environment through a visit to the shrine of Sankhasini Ma at Sankha Khullya village. The site features a sacred tamarind tree, regarded as a symbol of the goddess, alongside a snake that inhabits the tree and is also worshipped. This sacred site provides a meaningful example of how environmental elements, such as trees and animals, are deeply integrated into the social and religious practices of the community.

Observations:

The visit highlighted the intricate ways in which environmental elements, such as the tamarind tree and the snake, are woven into the local cultural and religious framework. The reverence for the tamarind tree and its connection with the goddess Sankhasini Ma reflects a symbiotic relationship between the natural environment and societal beliefs, illustrating the importance of nature in shaping cultural identities and religious practices. Students had face to face interaction with villagers, learned about the folklore and how nature is integrated within and through folklore.

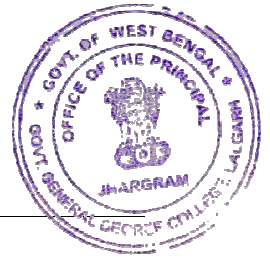

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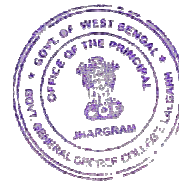

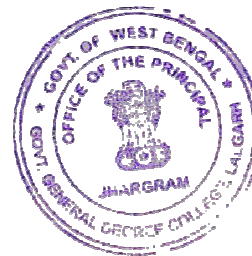

Study 1: Understanding the Experience of Menstruation of Women in Sankha Khullya Village

This study aimed to explore the cultural perceptions, taboos, and personal experiences related to menstruation among women in Sankha Khullya village. Interviews and group discussions revealed the traditional beliefs surrounding menstruation, challenges faced by women in accessing hygiene products, and the impact of these factors on their daily lives. The study shed light on the intersection of gender, health, and social norms in rural settings.

Study 2: Exploring Broom-Making as a Way of Income Generation in Sankha Khullya Village

This study focused on understanding broom-making as a livelihood practice in the village. Students examined the process, economic viability, and the role of this craft in supporting household incomes. 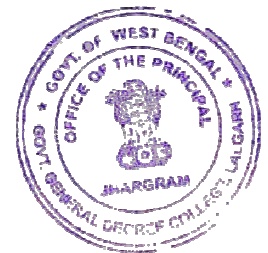
